When recording from the external AB inputs I get a very faint and random playback just once or not at all.. It's not a usable result and wandering if anybody had the same experience..

Following the manual, I've tried every recording option from the record menu to the track recording menus.. I did a system reset right after a few good tries and still not much going on terms of recording.. At first I thought I was broken, but now I'm beginning to point towards mister OT..

So I guess first can somebody tell me the simple steps in recording from external AB inputs after a system reset?

Thanx and I hope I'm missing something dumb... G

PS: I know the real manual is in the works but the one sent to us is confusing...

It seems that the inputs have a very wide range, I found that for line level stuff turning up the input gains in the mixer gives a decent level. Then I just turn up the voulume a bit in the amp page to bring it up to the level of the other tracks.

The good thing about this is for hot signals like from a modular or MD there is enough headroom, but it does mean for weaker signals a bit of gain is needed.

I hate to be critical, but I feel in OS 0.99 at least, the design of the sampling process is broken. Octatrack is a "sampler" and based off my experience with the MD I figured sampling would be really easy, fast & elegant, sadly it's none of these things.

So to get a sample going you have to do these steps,

Press the track button of an empty track to pick a track slot

Hold playback 1-2 seconds to edit the machine

Press right down left & down x times to change the machine in the slot to Flex Rx>recorder

Press enter twice to confirm

Press exit to get back to the main screen

Press function + record (ab or cd) to check the record settings

Decide on if you want to use a trig recorder or a manual recorder, let's use trig...

Press play and then record to start the sequencer

Press T1 to place a record trigger on the first track

- from now on the OT constantly records, replacing the sample buffer on every pass
- you will be hearing the live input not your sample

Press exit to get back to the main screen

Hold playback 1-2 seconds to edit the machine

Press enter to edit the machine

Press trim(LFO) and you can watch the sample being constantly overwritten

- turning off the trigger step seems to only change if you are monitoring the input
- the trim waveform still is being replaced by the input regardless of the trig step

Press oper(effect 2) to save the sample (which is still being overwritten)

Press enter to give the sample a name (which is still being overwritten)

Press up and down and right enter a name (sample still being overwritten)

- I miss the big data dial on the MD, and Level sometimes seems to be used on list views which is nice (sadly not used for entering text presently) but pressing level does not work as an enter key...

Press enter to set the name and finally stop overwriting the buffer

Press exit to go to the main screen

Press and hold playback to change the machines sample (still hearing the live input)

Hold down till you get to the bottom of the sample list for your project

Go to the first empty slot

Press enter three times to change the sample

Press down to find the sample in your list of samples

Press enter to load the sample that was most likely recorded at the wrong spot based on what the input was doing as you entered the name

Congratulations you are now playing a new sample!

This has me thinking about how recording should work, so I figure I'll make a list of steps as I'd like to see it working.

Press a track button and a record button to enter record mode - EG T5 and Record CD

- This sets Track 5 to use the Flex Machine set to Recorder 5 (by default, can be changed in Record Settings Page)
- This action brings up the Record Settings Page automatically and begins monitoring input

Record Settings Page would have the following parameters (press Track + Record to show)

Record Settings Page Source Mode RLength

Trig Mtype Recorder

Source sets as the input

Mode sets as the stereo input/summing mode (As is the AB,A,B,A+B now)

Rlength sets the number of bars to record for per trigger

Trig sets Recording trigger type - Pretty close to how it works now

Mtype - allows you to change the machine type

Recorder allows you to change the recorder slot Default is to match the current track

Once all settings are good the Octatrack waits for a trigger

- either a step added to the sequencer
- Or a press of the record button

Once a trigger has occurred the Octatrack switches to the Record Page and records to the active recorder slot for RLength bars. Once the recording length has passed the Recorder flips from monitoring the input to playing back the recorded passage. At this stage any record steps would become playback steps.

The Record Page contains the functions below assigned to Encoders. Pressing the Encoder enters the edit view appropriate to the function. (Press Function + Record button to show)

Record Page

Redo Settings Save Normalize Trim Slice

Redo clears the buffer and returns to monitoring the inputs and waiting for a trigger

Settings returns you to the Settings page Save opens the naming dialog to save the sample Normalize launches the normalize process Trim opens the Sample Trim Editor Slice opens the Sample Slice Editor

From any of these pages Exit will return you to Record Page.

I think this would simplify the process a lot and would allow one to redo samples quickly till you captured the source right. I'm thinking this is a little closer to the manual, but I think the manual seems to be skipping some of the automatic assignment stuff and the playback steps seem to be a bit more complex than this outline. I'm so excited by the concept of the Octatrack, I couldn't sleep last night knowing it was arriving today. I'd love to see it match our crazy expectations. What do you mean by "multiple automatic sampling"? I was messing around with multiple record triggers and it didn't seem to have much effect. Maybe my record length was too long. It didn't seem to me that the multiple triggers would be written to separate files, but to one file. Sounds like I might be missing something.

I think a big part of why I wanted to write out all the button steps is that when I first got the MD ages ago, it felt so simple. There was a lot of complexity you could get out of it, but it was all easy to access since it kinda has a "thin" user interface. That might sound bad but I mean thin as in light and fast as opposed to the Octatracks "deep" UI with lots of menus and layers and areas and settings, etc. I'm really hoping that the Octatrack OS can be simplified a little.

Having to manually name each file you want to store is going to break my heart, not to mention how convoluted the sampling process sounds. I have my OT on order for a Friday delivery that has not shipped yet and thinking really hard about holding off. Its possible I have misunderstood the products intention?

I would like to route no more than 2 devices and Midi trigger one of them while sampling on the fly in the OT with several live takes, possibly 50-100 takes or more in a single session. Maybe its over kill but with the storage on the unit i felt this would be no problem to store them in a simple manner, not wasting so much time naming each file because i want to store it in Rom. Guess the best idea is to plug it back into the computer and record the whole session and then chop and rename the samples and then import back into the OT? Kind of defeats the purpose i originally thought this unit was about.

Guys, I suggested this to them..

Problem: External sampling is too long and requires multiple fingers which is hard to work with while solo recording.

Try playing piano live with one hand and recording to track 8 manually!!

Solution: automatically assign a track and flex slot upon holding track+record (ab or cd or both) to nominate inputs. This is standby. Have cue turned on automatically for that selected input. Then press record (ab or cd or both) to record to the nominated track. Suggest active red light as conformation while recording. Buffer to flex.. If time max exceeded, save static to card. Upon completion, OT names and saves automatically so user can freely, without interruption, continue to sample live and fast to multiple tracks.

Note:

Internal track input(s) could be bottom trigs + record (ab or cd or both).

Oh and while recording, it should always default to trim view to view the wave. Almost everybody always prefers that while in session like most daws. Cheers
