yep, you can save on the fly. not in front of my OT right now, but as i remember, it is:

- 1. make recording
- 2. double-click the track button for the track on which you made the recording (or any track with a flex recorder)
- 3. navigate up the list of flex machines to the recorder in question
- 4. hit FUNCTION + BANK to go to the audio editor
- 5. go to OPERATIONS page and save the sample.

6. depending on your customization settings, the samples will be saved in either the project folder or the audio pool.

this is very fast to to do. samples are auto-named, so you could do it in about 5 seconds!
