Hi all,
I've noticed that my crossfader is behaving quite strangely : if I want to fade from scene B to scene A, when the crossfader hits its maximum course, scene B is on again and the cursor symbolizing the crossfader on the screen goes to the middle of the bar between A and B!:blink:
I've ran a couple of tests since and it appeared that when the crossfader is not at its maximum course but slightly before (1 unit), it behaves normally thus scene A is on. If I push it to max course (left) scene B is audible again
It well may be a bad contact but really I didn't spend a lot of time on the OT (have it for 2 months now) and never brutalized the crossfader. :angry:
Hope it's software but can't find any info!
Someone ever had this kind of problem ?

Crossfader in the OT are fantastic!! Very similar or exactly the same used in Rane ttm56 http://www.rane.com/ttm56.html#gpm1_1 Please correct me if I am wrong. At one point I had some bleed problems with one of my faders on the ttm56 but it was easily corrected by adjusting the magnetic sensor on the relevant side of the fader internally. They can take alot of punishment in fact I think the fader is so under used in the OT (dynamically rhythmically). Rane use to have a sewing machine permantly attached to the crossfader on their website constantly pumping the crossfader hundreds of times per minute to demonstrate how durable they were. DL the service manuals for the mixer for some servicing tips.

This is an infinium crossfader. Probably not the fader from the Octatrack, but still the same idea.

Please note the tiny silver "reflectors" or shields or hoods. They're similiar to your household burglar-alarm motiondetector. There is a printed plastic (encoder plate?) that glides between the two reflector/collectors. My best friend tried to be fly and put a little dab of oil on his Mackie D2 glider rails to get it to slide smoothly (an old Rane trick). The globs collected on the printed plastic piece, as well as pubes, dead-skin, and chocolate cake. Compressed air fixed it.

I had to clean mine recently. All better. If you try to blow air in the slot--be wary of compressed-air condensate/etc. Don't blow it while it's on.... I dunno. Have you ever turned your gwerty keyboard upside-down on your desk and shook it out?

This is an Infinium crossfader.

There are many like it, but this one is mine.

The screw type thing on the fore is a magnet, screw it clockwise (in) and the friction (magnetic) is greater anticlockwise and it gets less so until it can freely go side to side when tipped.

The red structure that clamps the bars is some kind of self lubricating material.

in the middle you can see a barcody type print, this is the optical reading reference, for the optical pickups inside the spacey silver domes.

If someone has tried to "make things better" with contact cleaner or get the fader sliding with lube, it'll just screw the readings up - compresssed air probably wont shift lubricant after that point, and the only remedy is to take things apart and clean with lint free cloth and shoot the owner of the lube spray. Warranties may be affected, but it worked for me,

I may be imagining this, but I seem to remember that Elektron said that early in the Octatrack production run, they got a few bad crossfaders that they had to replace.

By the way, I would strongly advise against using compressed air on electronic components, because it is often so compressed that it can damage delicate components. Instead, use one of these. They're cheap, easy to control, and never run dry.
