If you want a delay unit, you should check out the Eventide Timefactor. Absolutely brilliant. Only one problem- it's so awesome that you might start getting curious about the other Eventide pedals.. \$354 for an open box one at Nova Musik right now, or \$300ish used.

I absolutely love the Sherman, but it isn't subtle. Stuff that goes through a Moog MuRF tends to come out all happy and bubbly. The Sherman is the opposite of that- things often come out jagged, spiky, and malevolent...

The knob spacing on the T-Resonator is dense enough that it bugs me, but I have large hands. The M-Resonator is cheaper and has more room to get in there and play the thing. You lose the digital effects, but it still does the positive filter feedback trick where it can turn anything into dangerous amounts of bass. It can make the wimpiest kicks capable of splitting rocks, and it'll make whispers sound like a UFO landing on your roof. Go a little too far and you get the death ray. Almost destroyed my speakers with subsonics once- no sound at all, just lots of moving air. Luckily, I felt the wind blowing out of the speakers as I went by- I was about to leave the room for a break. Never use a T-Res, M-Res, or Sherman with headphones..

as regards adjusting the Machinedrum's sound in general, i find that simply playing MD through a mixer, and adjusting the mixer channel 3 band eq.

does a lot to bring out the frequencies i want to hear from the MD (changes depending on the pattern tho)... i use a djm800 dj mixer however any mixer with bass, mid, treble is fine.

also, the internal Machinedrum Master FX eq has a huge effect on the Kit's sound.

and keeping all individual machine Volume parameters(the p-lockable one) no higher than midway can help when going for a fuller overall sound.

(with Master volume at 3'o'clock and individual Levels anywhere they want to be). this way, there is some headroom when adjusting the MasterFX eq section.
