It would most likely take the form of a sysex of the individual sounds along with a text description of each sound, some example patterns and kits. The sounds would be categorised into kick, snare, clap, hi hat, etc. I'd try to cover a fairly wide range of sounds probably grouped into sets of 10, so 10 kicks, 10 snares, then one group of 8 (12x10 +8)

Thanks for the input good peoples:)

Couple of things:

I want them to be reasonably priced so that perhaps guys who would not normally go for such a thing might take a punt, and yes the emphasis is very much going to be with the idea of providing a bit of documentation so that the sounds can be used 'as-is' so that the descriptor of say 909 snare or BoomyBD will reflect with some accuracy the type of sound, BUT also so that they can be used as starting points for further tweaking if you want to, I don't really like names that don't give an idea of what to expect, as for most of us music time is better spent on making music than browsing sounds, mostly.

Of course I will try to cover a decent useable pallette of sounds, but like anything personal taste comes into it, but I will not include any gimmick sounds that no-one is going to find useful, if anything the sounds will be geared toward techno/house/electro and the like.

I'm not really in a position at this early stage to write up massive details of each sound, but there will be some demos made and of course once you load the sound it is guite easy to see what is going on, I'd never rule out the possibility of writing a synthesis guide but I think that would be far more in depth than the scope of this first project.

I am happy to do other types of soundbanks like basses, pads, leads, fx etc later, but I've settled on drums for this first one to see how it goes.

Believe me, I'd love to do it all for free (indeed, anyone who knows me for a while knows that I have given sample packs and kits away before here and other places) but like everyone else I have bills to pay, and if you don't think the demos sound good, don't buy them.

Anyway thanks for all the input so far, off to bed now, I will reply to PM's tomorrow:kiss:

Thanks for the responses guys.
I think pricing is always a tricky thing to judge, but bear in mind a LOT of work is going into this to make it right, yes you can reverse engineer the sounds - that is part of the idea, but also I'm aiming to make the sounds very suitable to use asis, a 909 type snare for example - most of the work is getting the correct time response of each of its components, once you do that it sounds 909ish, the scope then is for user tweaks is things lke noise level, tuning, decay.
I'm a big fan of tutorials, even done more than a few myself, as well as free kits, but this is something different, think of it as a time saver - I don't really expect everyone to load up 128 of these sounds into their machine and start sounding all the same, the idea is make them your own, view them as shortcut templates for your productions. Remember I am going to have documentation describing each sound - this is NOT going to be along the lines of 'how I made this sound' but rather a description that tells you what it is, and perhaps suggested tweaks, a few lines of text for each. So you can read through the doc and choose which to load, rather than having to clear the machine and load in the whole bank.
Now, one more thing - would you guys prefer that I stick to the original idea of 128 drum sounds, or would you prefer to have say a 50/50 split with other sounds like leads, basses, pads, etc? Again if I went this route I'd focus on mostly staple 'bread and butter' sounds rather than distinctive niche sounds that sound impressive but you'll never end up using.

Thanks for the input again guys, ok I will stick to the original plan of 128 drum sounds, I will try to get them finished as quickly as possible, but I am quite picky so I will prefer to take a little longer and get some really great and useable sounds, pretty much a large portion will be 'standards' like for example 909 and 808 type kick, snare, as well as some new stuff which are not too gimmicky or identifiable as 'presets'.
I will make each sound as a individual loadable sysex, as well as a whole bank, I will also make a recording to allow auditioning of the sounds without the hassle of having to load it first, probably in the format of all kicks, then all snares etc, so then it is a case of sitting with a pen and noting which ones you want to load. I have no illusions that everyone is going to want to load them all in because I would not myself and it is a hassle to the user to have to do that I think.
I will make demo patterns too, but these are more for auditioning or ideas than intended to be impressive demo's, which are not actually useful. Right?
Realistically probably looking at a month or 2, but rest assured I will post updates in this thread.

There will be 128 sounds in this pack, they will all be drums, I have been asked to do some other packs of non drum sounds which I am considering, I guess it all depends on how well the first pack is recieved, the main issue I think for most people, is that making sounds is time consuming, the idea behind my soundpacks is that they can be used as shortcuts. For example a 909 type BD or 303 type bass have to have certain characteristics to sound right, so my sounds will be good enough to use as-is or as a starting point for the users own variation.
The next pack would focus on staple classic synth sounds, from the 70s-90s, then possible future packs might be themed in some other way, for example to suit a particular genre. I'm also going to be doing samle packs for the Octatrack if there is sufficient interest.
By the way the drum sound pack should be ready real soon now, just finishing up, so a couple more days I reckon.
