thats absurd. I mean, think about what a \$2500 mac is - my dual G4 was purchased for \$1,200 new from a mac dealer. This thing can handle anything thrown at it. For over twice the money you can most likely get the dual G5 - no PC is gonna come close that costs \$1000 - even a dual athalon whatever.

I dont know man, my older G3 ibook runs live quite well. The only thing slowing it down is the speed of the internal drive - the same will be true for even the newest powerbook. Laptop drives are generally 4500 RPM - thats too slow for live. However, when you run live off of an external drive over firewire a laptop will blow your mind with what it can do.

If you have a powerbook running live and you are having issues, its probably more to do with user error than the CPU. You can probably run live off of a wristwatch - its efficient and compact - however, where your samples are loading from is a completely different story altogether.
