i think it really depends on what your approach when going live is. what you want to be able to do while palying, etc. Here is one example of a thing the MD's sequencer doesn't allow for (enough): i want to be able to make a smooth transition from any theme/track in my set to any other. that means i want to keep elements of the 1st theme playing while mixing in elements of the 2nd. so ie. kick of theme 1 with snare of theme 2, etc. Now if i wanted to do that with my MD i would have

to make 'transition' patterns and kits. that would work if i had a fixed order in my set but i want to have freedom of choice > enter Live

well - consider making kits that are only 8 pieces let me explain:
basically, a 16 track percussion sewuencer is a shitload. A 16 piece kit - also a lot. In my set - I do not use my MD, rather, I use my Xbase which gives me only 4 pieces! Plus I dedicate 2 tracks of the monomachine so that is 6 pieces total. What I propose offers you 2 more than I ever use.
So, you can have slot 1 be for kick - and also slot 9, and then build 2 kits out of the same kit. Then have essentially 2 patterns on the same pattern, which can make for a hugely smooth transition using mutes - or even the global mutes in song mode.
Its just a thought, intended to make you take another look at hardware :-D
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
